The origins of Mahidol University date back over 120 years to the creation of a medical school at Thailand's first hospital (Siriraj Hospital). #### **Abstract Submission Guidelines**

- 1. Must be limited to 350 words (excluding title, author and affiliation)
- Background: statement of the public health issue that is addressed by your study; what is known and what is not known.
- Study Question: one sentence stating your study question(s).
- Methods: concise description of study design, data sources and analysis methods; including study limitations.
- Result: key findings from data analysis and liminations.
- Conclusions: summary statement of key findings.
- Public Health Implications: statement of potential uses of this study for science, policy, programs, public or provider education.
- 2. Edit abstracts carefully before submission.


